## Equine First Aid Kit

**Tool box-** large enough to store everything

**Flashlight-** for accidents at night

**Wire cutters-** to free horses from fence or wire

**Screwdriver-** lever

**Knife-** cut tangled rope or caught halter

**Hoof pick-** clean hoof and examine for injuries

**Bandage scissors-** cutting off dressings

**Thermometer**

**10-15 ft Cotton Rope-** instant halter or twitch

**Skin Cleanser-** Betadine scrub for minor cuts and scrapes

**White Tape-** 1 or 2 inch wide rolls

**Sterile 4x4 Gauze or Telfa Pads-** to apply medication or applying direct pressure to wound

**Leg Bandages-** quilted cotton or sheet cotton

**Polo Wraps, Brown Gauze or Vetwrap-** holds on leg wraps, puts pressure on bleeding wounds

**Topical Antibacterial Spray-** Topazone, etc.

**Granulex Spray-** for deeper minor cuts, especially wounds below the knees and hocks

**Roll non-** sterile cotton- pad around wound

**Towels-** to dry hands and equipment, padding for wrap
